Mitcham Rotary is a joint partner with RC Adelaide Light and RC Hervey Bay Sunrise Queensland in this project to provide safe drinking water to the villages of Sulamali (125 households, population 587) and Lookeu Foho (89 households, population of 355). Both villages are on the outskirts of 'Suai'-large town on south coast of Timor Leste.

Water and sanitation hygiene are the foundations of good health and this infrastructure is urgently needed in Timor Leste which is still recovering form the destruction of 75% of its infrastructure 22 years ago when this small nation finally gained its independence.

I am pleased to inform members that the project has been endorsed for a global grant and is now proceeding.

# Rotary Australia Re-purposing Equipment (RARE)

Dave Cockshell joined Rotary in 2001 with RC Gawler Light. President in 2005/6. Assistant Governor Group 9 in District 9500 for 3 years. Since 2010 he has been the Chairman/Regional Manager of Donations in Kind - Central Region (now Rotary Australia Repurposing Equipment). Dave was awarded Rotary International's Service Above Self Award in 2020 and in 2024, an Order of Australia Medal (OAM) for his service to the geophysical profession and Rotary programs.

RARE is a major programme within RAWCs, it helps clubs and other organisations get surplus goods to

communities in need. The programme is Australia wide with five regions each having a RARE operation. In South Australia RARE's warehouse is in Edinburgh Parks.

The types of donated goods RARE deals with are: medical equipment, supplies and instruments; dental equipment, hospital furniture; domiciliary equipment; school books, desks and chairs etc; computers and audio visual equipment; toys, clothes and eyeglasses; gardening and workshop tools; sewing machines and musical instruments.

RARE works through the program connecting with people and organisations wanting to donate goods, collecting the goods and then sorting, checking, cleaning and storing them and making the shipping arrangements. Clubs provide the link to communities in need, collating the required goods, funding of freight costs and finally distributing the goods.

Over the last 10 years ten projects (comprising of multiple shipping containers) have been completed and sent to the South West Pacific, South East Asis and Africa.

Each individual container costs between \$3,000 and \$11,000 to ship.
